A Chance for Children NGO (ACFC) was **founded in 2008** by Stefan Pleger and Gabi Ziller from Austria and a group from Uganda. Part of this team was Ceasar Lukango, now chairman of the NGO. Betty Nabulimu is the coordinator.

Their vision: to help vulnerable Ugandan children access quality education and break the cycle of poverty.

From 40 children supported at the start, ACFC now reaches over **2,200 students across 8 districts:**

Mityana, Mubende, Mpigi, Kasanda, Kakumiro, Gomba, Kyankwanzi, and Bukedea (under construction).
